

Labour Market Information, Labour Gap Analysis & Training Needs Assessment	FTM Training Programs
<p>The Alliance of Manitoba Sector Councils (AMSC) collects ongoing labour market information from the sectors councils and their stakeholders. The AMSC is funded and supported by Industry Services (IS).</p> <p>FTM obtains Labour Market Information and Training Needs Information from the following sources:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FTM's annual training needs survey is sent to production companies, labour organizations & crewmembers. • The FTM board of directors consists of representatives from the DGC MB, IATSE 856, ACTRA MB, OSM, RRC, MITT, and the NSI) The producers that sit on the board represent different facets of the community (drama, documentary / factual-based content and variety programming). • FTM's board of directors reviews the annual training priorities and training activities. • Industry training committees and industry representatives provide information to determine FTM activities. (ACTRA MB, IATSE 669, IATSE 856, DGC MB, OSM, WFW) • FTM consults with production companies at the onset of every production to assess labour gaps and workforce training needs. • FTM works with labour organizations to review training needs and determine the best training options at the onset of all local union and guild sanctioned productions. • Training needs data is gathered from workshop evaluations. • Training needs data is gathered from work experience trainer evaluations. 	<p>Crew Training – Online Courses - FTM provides these entry-level courses to new workers. The courses are required for membership to IATSE 856, IATSE 669, the DGC MDC and ACTRA MB.</p> <p>Crew Training – Entry-Level - FTM provides workshop training to new workers to develop essential work skills.</p> <p>Crew Training – Advanced-Level - FTM provides workshop training to existing workers to develop their technical and professional skills.</p> <p>Crew Work Experience Training – Entry-Level - FTM provides paid on-the-job training to workers entering the sector to develop technical and professional skills. Trainees develop essential technical skills under the guidance of a designated trainer.</p> <p>Crew Work Experience Training – Advanced-Level - FTM provides on-the-job training to existing workers that are advancing within their departments. Crewmembers develop technical and professional skills under the guidance of a designated trainer or mentor.</p> <p>Writer/Director/Producer Training - FTM provides workshop training to develop the skills of emerging and intermediate writers, directors and producers.</p> <p>ACTRA Training – Intermediate & Advanced - FTM provides workshop training to existing actors to develop business and technical skills.</p> <p>Outreach / Career Awareness - FTM participates in post-secondary career awareness events to promote jobs in the industry. These events take place throughout the year.</p> <p>FTM works with secondary and post secondary institutions to coordinate industry speakers for career awareness sessions. FTM is an active member of the Manitoba Career Prospects program (MCP), which connects the sector councils to Manitoba schools through their website. FTM participates in MCP activities throughout the year.</p>
