About the workshop

During this 90-minute lecture, Manitoba based lawyer, Andrew Buck, will conduct a presentation which will consist of a general overview of the privacy laws which apply to Manitoba businesses. The session will include an overview of PIPEDA — the private sector of privacy law — and The Privacy Act.

The second part of the presentation will focus on specific privacy issues such as: employee snooping, use of SINs, function creep and potential social media issues.

Please note: following the lecture there will be a 15 – 30 minute Q & A. The presentation is open to the public and is targeted to anyone looking to learn more about Privacy Laws.

About the Instructor

Andrew Buck has a business law practice, with a focus on electronic commerce issues. He provides guidance about online delivery of goods and services, privacy, data protection, access to information, anti-spam law compliance, and intellectual property control and capitalization.
