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Message From FTM's Board Chairperson, Andrew Yankiwski

COVID-19 has created substantial challenges in our industry, but FTM's team has played a major role in providing hands-on learning to promote a healthy and safe production environment. Due to the changes in the Province of Manitoba's Sector Council Program and prior to the promotion of FTM's new Managing Director, FTM had been projected to run a deficit in 2019-2020. As a result of the hard work and ingenuity of FTM's new leadership, staff, board and partners, FTM dramatically grew our partnerships and overall services. This moved FTM out of a deficit into a modest surplus in the same fiscal year.

Pre-COVID-19, FTM broke the previous record attendance of 1419 participations in 2018-2019 to 1435 participations in 2019-2020. This was accomplished under very difficult circumstances. This past year, FTM conducted a full restructuring of our staff, board reforms to promote better governance and accountability, a move of FTM's office and a successful company rebranding. FTM also grew its Facebook following to be the most liked and followed support organization in Manitoba's film industry.

In the past year, FTM became an innovative hub for Manitoba's film industry. FTM's new logo was unveiled at FILM EXPO 2020, our signature annual event for film and television professionals. The unveiling also corresponded to FTM's Winnipeg Transit ad campaign: ACTION!

In addition, FTM launched an innovative profile series, the 20 for the 20th. Over 20 weeks FTM profiled a select group of dynamic Manitoba-based film and television professionals that have instructed for FTM, served as mentors and completed our internship program. The subjects of the interview series discussed the departments they work in; their professional background and how new workers can get involved in Manitoba's film and television industry.

In less than a year, these important changes and innovations led to FTM's participant revenues expanding to the highest levels in the company's 20-year history. I again want to commend our team for all of the outstanding service and thank the Province of Manitoba's Department of Economic Development and Training for their critical support.

As FTM's new chairperson, I also wish to thank Graham Thompson who completed nine years of service as a director on the FTM board. Graham's experience helped FTM to grow as an organization and his service has been a major asset. FTM has requested that Graham remain on our Finance Committee and we look forward to him continuing to be an important member of FTM. I also wish board members whose time with FTM has ended the very best with their futures.

I look forward to an exciting year of innovation and training for 2020-2021.

Message from FTM's Managing Director, Adam Smoluk

In recent months the COVID-19 pandemic has provided unprecedented global challenges and Manitoba's film industry is working collaboratively to address these issues. The effects of COVID-19 began to disrupt Manitoba at the end of the

2019-2020 fiscal year. At that time, Film Training Manitoba (FTM) shifted our training to launch programming in the new fiscal year of 2020-2021. I am writing this message in the summer of 2020 and FTM has already conducted 15 individual COVID-19 training sessions for well over 500 industry participants.

In 2019-2020, FTM's two senior staff members, Allison Bile and Mauro Ferritto, managed their divisions with skill and distinction. I wanted to highlight just a few of their many outstanding accomplishments. Mauro worked with Vincent Design to launch FTM's successful new company rebranding at FILM EXPO 2020, a new fully online registration process, and a redesign of our company's website. There is no doubt that these important outputs modernized FTM's services for new and existing film and television professionals.

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Allison managed FTM's segments in the Women in Trades Conference, which led directly to partnering with the Manitoba Institute of Trades and Technology (MITT) to launch the ACTION! Plan. This important partnership led to thirty MITT students to undertaking FTM's flagship Set Orientation course. I wanted to thank MITT's Ray Karasevich, Beverlie (Bev) Stuart, Marnie Groeneveld and Manitoba Film and Music's CEO and Film Commissioner Rachel Rusen who all aided in developing this important new strategic partnership.

Allison also played a leading role our industry's response to COVID-19 by connecting with Manitoba Economic Development & Training, which led to receiving partnership support from the Manitoba Tourism Education and Training Council (MTEC). MTEC helped develop SMART START: COVID-19 Cleaning and Sanitization that was instructed by film industry veteran Lesley Oswald. This course was attended by over 200 film industry participants and had among the best course evaluations in FTM's history. I do wish to thank MTEC's CEO Shannon Fontaine and Melenie Olfert for their excellent support.

All of FTM's training is a result of the fantastic support of FTM's board of directors, Manitoba production companies, ACTRA MB, The City of Winnipeg, the DGC MB District Council, IATSE 856, ICG 669, Indigenous Filmmakers Association, Manitoba Film and Music, Les Productions Midcan Productions, William F. White and SAFE Work MB --FTM's training could not exist without their critical support. FTM is grateful to the Province of Manitoba's Department of Economic Development and Training for all of their support. The staff members Laurenda Madill, Louie Odorico, and Allison Elliott have been very helpful with providing FTM with advice and support. FTM also wishes to thank Philip Houde the CEO of the Economic Development Office and the Honourable Ralph Eichler (Minister of Economic Development and Training) for directly engaging with FTM's team during these challenging times.

There is no doubt COVID-19 provides a great deal of challenges but as the manager of this charity, I will continue to provide responsive training that supports a safe, healthy and an open industry to every Manitoban wanting to work in our growing film and television industry.

Work Experience Program

Work experience is a valuable opportunity for participants to learn more about the film and television industry and to explore future career paths within the sector.

Through FTM's work experience program, participants are given the opportunity to develop their skills and cultivate strong networks within the industry. FTM provides on-the-job training to new and established technicians in order to expand the number of skilled crew members working in Manitoba. This program's aim is to aid in succession planning for production companies and industry-related organizations. FTM partners with local production companies to offer valuable work experience opportunities.

Crew Mentorship Program

FTM's crew mentorship program provides training opportunities for qualified crew already working in the local film and television industry, and who are seeking a focused professional development opportunity. By pairing experienced and established crew with someone who is moving into a more senior position, the program helps participants build on their knowledge and abilities to do the job of a more senior crewmember.

Outreach Program

In an ongoing effort to build support and increase awareness of careers available to Manitobans in the film and television industry, FTM continually liaises with educational and training institutions. Year-round visits to universities, trade schools, colleges, and high schools provide an opportunity for individuals to learn more about careers in media production. As a result of FTM staff attending outreach events, students have a better understanding of the jobs and careers available to them



Career Development Sessions

FTM attends career development events and delivers information sessions throughout the year, across Manitoba. FTM is proud to share information with students and the general public, to bring awareness to and provide information on career options within the film and television industry



School Program

Youth tend to have a high interest in filmmaking but have little knowledge of the jobs that are available to them, or how to find and build a career in the film and television industry. In order to increase awareness, and reach potential crew members, FTM delivers tailored information sessions to students across the province, providing information on careers in the film and television industry.

Information Sessions & Career Guidance

FTM recognizes the importance of community outreach and offers free sessions for those considering a career in the film and television industry. These consultations provide an overview of the opportunities available for those finding their way into the sector. FTM visited 5 secondary and 4 post-secondary schools in Manitoba. Through these outreach sessions delivered by FTM, 150 participants learned about work opportunities in the film and television industry. In 2019-2020, FTM provided in-office career counselling for 85 individuals who were looking for guidance about starting, or upgrading, their careers in the local film and television industry.



Canada-Manitoba Jobs Grant (CMJG)

This federal-provincial program was created to help Manitoba workers gain the skills they need to fill available jobs and to help employers develop the required labour skills labour The Directors Guild of Canada - Manitoba was awarded this grant and partnered with FTM to deliver two Set Orientation, Safety Awareness, and Respect in the Workplace training.
